The Bandstand

Built by the Sterlings', father & son, in 1876 as a memorial to Gallia County Civil War Veterans. Today it is recognized as a symbol of the City of Gallipolis.



Stone Monolith

At the center of the entrance to the Park on First Avenue marks the height of the Ohio River floods of 1884, 1907, 1913, and 1937.



Kerr Memorial Fountain

Donated by the family of Charles D. Kerr, who owned and operated a drugstore on Second Avenue. It is in memory of their son who drowned in the Ohio River. In 2019 the fountain was restored.



Yellow Fever Memorial

The white pillar holds a replica of the rocker arm from the steamer John Porter. It is a memorial to the 66 people who died of yellow fever when the boat brought the disease to Gallipolis in 1878.



Ohio Historical Marker 1-27

This official Ohio historical marker commemorates the founding of Gallipolis. This marker can be found on the Second Avenue side of the Park.



Spirit of the American Doughboy

Created in 1931 to honor veterans of World War I. The memorial was enlarged to include a wall listing the names of all Gallia County War Veterans.



Ohio Historical Marker 13-27

This official Ohio historical marker sits along First Avenue and recognizes the importance of the Welsh settlement in our community.



La Vue Premiere

This statue was created by artist William P. Hopen. Unveiled in October 1990 during the City's Bicentennial. The statue symbolizes the unconquerable spirit of the first French settlers to Gallipolis. Located on First Avenue at the south corner of the park.



Ohio Historical Marker 14-27

This official Ohio historical marker on the river side recounts the strategic importance of the city in the Union Army's defense during the Civil War and the influence of the Ohio River in transportation.



Park Clock

The park clock was installed in 2002. Shortly after being installed it failed and ceased working. There are plans to repair the clock by the City of Gallipolis.
